## House and Trustee Committee Communication

Dear Members,

At our last regular Lodge meeting on May 23, the Trustees recommended to the Lodge four motions for Lodge approval. One of those items is to have our roof repaired. The roof was damaged, as all those who live here in Los Alamos know, two years ago when we had the terrible hail storm that damaged many roofs and other property here in Los Alamos. The Trustees have spent the past two years getting quotes from various contractors along with working with the insurance company to adjust our claims in an effort to get the most we could for the repairs and to bring our roof and porches up to code.

We have \$37,200 from the proceeds of the insurance claim, and in order to do all needed repairs to our roof, an additional \$1,800 dollars was needed, which the Lodge membership approved.

The second item recommended by the Trustees to the Lodge membership, was the approval of \$500 dollars to buy paint and supplies to paint the ceiling in the club area. Fred Humphries has been gracious enough to volunteer his skill in repainting the club ceiling, which will be done after the roof is repaired.

The third item was a recommendation from the House and Trustees to re-core and key all external doors to the Lodge. After further discussion and questions from the membership in attendance this motion was tabled for further discussion.

The fourth item recommended by the House and Trustees was to receive funds to get a new ice machine for the bar area, which was also approved.

We as House and Trustee members are proud to put our Lodge funds to work to make improvements to our facility.

Members, please note the diagram and floor plan posted in the Lodge to view further improvements that we plan on making to the inside of our Lodge.

We as Committee members and Elks Members appreciate and value any and all feedback you have at any time regarding the maintenance and well-being of our Lodge.

*"The 14th day of June of each year is hereby designated as 'Flag Day', and the President of the United States is authorized and requested to issue annually a proclamation calling upon officials of the Government to display the flag of the United States on all Government buildings on such day, and urging the people to observe the day as the anniversary of the adoption on June 14, 1777, by the Continental Congress of the Stars and Stripes as the official flag of the United States of America." - U.S. Code, Title 36, Chapter 9, Section 157, signed into law by President Harry S. Truman on August 3, 1949*

**Our flag has flown high in our hearts, homes and in our establishments. The symbolisms of our flag's stars and stripes have a tender and rich history. Each color within our flag's beauty has a special meaning. The white stripes stand for purity and innocence, and the red stripes stand for hardiness and valor. These alternating stripes represent each of the thirteen original colonies. The blue field is significant of vigilance, perseverance, and justice, and it is accompanied by the stars that are emblematic of the endeavor and aspiration of mankind.**

Please join our Elk's Lodge in celebrating this special day, and to **give thanks** to those who have served or have sadly sacrificed their lives to protect the land we love and the flag we so proudly display in our homes and communities.
